

# Exercise Episode 015

The Lovers Meet Scene

#### TASK:

Write your original lyrics about how meeting the One left your song's character's worse off than before BUT by including some little spark of hope at the end.

- Use past tense to start telling the story about who your main character was before and what he was doing before he met that person they can't stop thinking about. Use past tense also to show where your character is stuck before you move to the present.
- Use present tense at the last part of your song to not only connect the past with the present but to show that your character has climbed out of the hole they were stuck in.
- Make sure your character is not getting what they WANT (their love interest), but instead get what they NEED (mature to make a better decision about their situation in life and how they can start living it again. They need to take action.)
- 4. Use **first-person** (pronoun "I") to make the listener connect with what your character had to go through.
- 5. Address the person they are referring to in the **third person**. If you dare, shift to direct address at the end of the song to establish a closer connection between the main character and his love interest.
- 6. Include all **five commandments**. Keep them in order this time.

## ABSTRACT BEATS to use in your lyrics

- Commandment 1: Inciting Incident: (Introducing the setting and the main character)
  - Establish the setting and your character at the beginning of your song by slowly letting your listener ease into your story. Make sure everything you tell your audience is relevant to your story and helps to move it forward.
- Commandment 2: Turning Point = Lovers first Meet
  - The turning point will be meeting that special girl or boy for the very first time. No matter your character's decision (approach that person or not talk to them), something needs to keep them stuck and stop them from moving on.
- The reason WHY
  - 'The reason WHY' refers to the cause of why your main character won't be able to act (make a better decision in their upcoming crisis) and why they will get stuck in their false hope. So you basically show why their love interest is so great/interesting/unreachable/amazing ...
- Commandment 3: 1st Crisis
  - You can leave out the first crisis. But make sure to include the turning point and the first decision your character makes in order to show the listener how your character got stuck in their situation.
- Commandment 4: 1st Decision
  - Show your character's lack of action by not making him use his chance when it presented itself. This decision is why your character has to deal with being stuck in the following verse.
- Commandment 5: 1st Resolution
  - The resolution is the big hole the character fell in after their first decision not to use their chance.
- Not being able to let go.
  - Emphasize the ongoing circle of missing out on life each day by wasting away, hoping for something that might never happen.
- Commandment 3: 2nd Crisis
  - It's not necessary to include the crisis by showing the character weighing his/her options. But it should be clear that the character is missing out on living his life if they continue the path they're on.
- Commandment 4: 2nd Decision
  - Show the character's decision by an action they are taking that shows they are taking the first step to move on or do something about their situation.
- Commandment 5: 2nd Resolution
  - You don't need to include a resolution. But you can imply a hint even if it's
    just between the lines.
